William Regenhart a native of Germany and formerly
 a subject to William Duke of Brunswick appears in open
 court and applies to be admitted a citizen of the United States
 of America and appearing that said applicant on the fifteenth
 day of May A.D. 1852 before the clerk of the Caprebian Circuit
 Court filed his application under oath of intention to become
 a citizen of the United State of America and it further appe-
 aring to the satisfaction of the Court from the oath of
 Henry Brandt and William Beersmith who are known
 to the Court to be Citizens of the United States and that app-
 licant for the last five years has resided within the limits
 and under the jurisdiction of the United States and for
 the last three years within the State of Missouri and that
 during that time he has behaved as a person of Good Mor-
 al character attached to the principles of the Constitution
 of the United State and well disposed to the good order
 and Happiness of the Same Whereof the said
 William Regenhart declares on oath that he will sup-
 port the Constitution of the United of America and that
 he doth and Entirely and absolutely renounce and abjure
 all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign Prince Potentate
 State or Sovereignty whatsoever and particularly to Wil-
 am Duke of Brunswick of whom he was formerly a
 subject

Therefore it is ordered by The Court that
 the said William Regenhart be admitted a
 citizen of the United States of America

William Traupe a native of Germany and formerly a
 subject of William Duke of Brunswick appears in open
 Court and applies to be admitted a citizen of the United
 State of America and it appearing that applicant
 on the third day of January A.D. 1852 before the clerk of
 Caprebian Circuit Court filed his application
