Dr. Engelbrecht fell on an icy highway this winter and suffered injuries by reason of which he was taken to a St. Louis hospital, where he also underwent an operation. he also underwent an operation. Fairly well recovering, he request-ed to be taken home, where later he became ill with double pneu-monia. After recovery, he this week suffered a strope, which proved fatal. He was born near Drake, later

studying medicine and graduated from St. Louis Medical College. In 1893 he married Miss Anna 9 a Hilkerbaumer, the couple residing for over a year at Berger, where Dr. Engelbrecht practised his prof fession, then locating at Stonyhill. n Their union was blessed with seven n children, two of whom preceded their father in death.
