An Egg Problem

A farmer sent his three sons to market with eggs to sell. To the first he gave 50; to the second 30, and to the third 10; which they were to sell at the same price, and each bring home an equal amount of money. At what price were the eggs sold, and how much money did each bring home?

Answer to the Egg problem

They first sold them at 7 eggs for 1 cent. The first sold 7¢ worth, and had 1 egg left. The second sold 4 cts worth and had 2 eggs left, and the third sold 1 ct worth and had 3 eggs left. They next sold the balance at 3 cts apiece, So that each realized 10 cts for the eggs he had and all sold at the same rate.
