

In the Name of God Amen the Twenty first day of February in the year of
our Lord one thousand seven Hundred Fifty and Eight George Fleming of Mississippi
Hundred in the County of Kent yeoman being Old and infirm in Body but of perfect
Mind and Memory thanks be given unto God. Therefore calling unto mind the Mortality
of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all Men once to Die, do make and
ordain this my last Will and Testament (that is to say) Principally and first of all I give
and recommend my Soul unto the Hands of God that give it, And for my Body I recommend
it to the Earth to be Buried in a Christian like and Decent manner at the Discretion of my
Executors nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again
by the mighty Power of God, and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath
pleased God to bless me in this Life, I Give Devise and Dispose of the same in the following
manner and form. I Give and Bequeath to Elizabeth my Dearly beloved
wife One Horse and Saddle over and above the thirds of my Estate both Real & Personal
after my lawful Debts are paid. Item I Give to my well beloved Sons Samuel Fleming
and George Fleming my Plantation wheron I now live with all the appurtenances
thereunto belonging to be Equally divided between the said Samuel and George when
they both come to full Age, And also the one half of my Personal Estate after my just
and lawful Debts are Paid, but if either of my two Sons should die without lawful
Issue my Will and Desire is that the Survivor shall Enjoy the Others Part.
I Give to my well beloved Daughters Martha Fleming and Esther Fleming all the rest
and residue of my Estate being the one half to be Equally Divided between them
the said Martha and said Esther when they both arrive to the Age of sixteen years.
And so hereby Authorize constitute and appoint my loving wife Elizabeth Fleming
and my friend Archibald Fleming my only and sole Executors of this my last
Will and Testament, And so do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul all
and every Other former Testaments Wills and Legacies Bequests and Executors by me
in any ways before this Time named willed and Bequeathed Ratifying and Confirm-
ing this and no Other to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have
Signed Sealed published pronounced and declared by the
said George Fleming as his last Will and Testament in
Presence of us the Subscribers Robert Killen Robert ^{mark} Fleming William Killen
Personally appeared before me Robert Killen and Robert Fleming two of the Subscribing
Witnesses of within Will and being duly Sworn do declare that they did see and hear
George Fleming Sign Seal publish pronounce and declare the within Instrument
to be his last Will and Testament that at the Time of so doing and saying
he was to the best of their Belief of sound and disposing Mind and Memory, that they
did Sign their names as witnesses thereunto at his Request, and that they did
see ~~that~~ William Killen Sign as one other witness thereunto. In Testimony
whereof I have here unto set my Hand this 25 Day of May 1759.
