

Cape Postmaster in Washington to Get Mail Service Award

WASHINGTON (AP) — Theodore R. Regenhardt, postmaster at Cape Girardeau, Mo., was a special guest today as the Postoffice Department unveiled some new mechanized equipment at the main postoffice in Washington.

Regenhardt was one of six postmasters from across the nation who were honored by the department yesterday and today for improving mail service in their home cities.

They have been cited in the past year by the Postmasters Gazette, official periodical of the National Association of Postmasters, for Improving efficiency in their offices.

Postmaster General Arthur Summerfield and other government officials attended a dinner in their honor last night.

Postmaster Regenhardt, the first Cape Girardeau postmaster to be so honored, departed Sunday morning for Washington after being advised he had been chosen.

Selection of the six outstanding postmasters was based on a survey made at several levels.
