Charles Scott Esquire Governor of the Commonwealth of
Kentucky to all to whom these presents shall come greeting
Know ye that by virtue and in consideration of a Certificate
Number Eight hundred and one granted by the County Court
of Warren in July Eight hundred and two agreeably to an act of
Assembly for settling and improving the vacant lands of
the Commonwealth there is granted by the said Commonwealth
unto Alexander Gilliland and as^{so} of Robert Gilliland a certain
tract or parcel of land containing two hundred and fifty acres
by survey bearing date the twenty first day of January One
Thousand Eight hundred and forty lying and being in the County
of Warren on the waters of Drake creek and bounded as
followeth (to wit): Beginning at a Hickory corner
beginning corner of Alexander Gilliland one hundred and fifty
acre survey as^{so} of Lewis Phillips running South thirty East
one hundred and fifty six poles with said line to stake thence
with Alexander Gilliland line South sixty West one hundred
and fifty six poles to a post oak corner of Alexander Gilliland
thence with said Gilliland line North thirty West one hundred
and fifty six poles to a stake thence South sixty West seventy
poles to a stake in a conditional line made between Robert
Gilliland and James Butler thence with said conditional line
South thirty five East two hundred and twenty two poles to two Black
oaks on Alexander Gilliland line thence with said line North
sixty East one hundred and eighty poles to two post oaks thence
North thirty West two hundred and sixteen poles to a post
oak thence South sixty West eighty poles to the Beginning
with its appurtenances to have and to hold the said tract or
parcel of land with its appurtenances to the said Alexander
Gilliland and his heirs forever In witness whereof the said
Charles Scott Esquire Governor of the Commonwealth of
Kentucky hath hereunto set his hand and caused the seal
of the said Commonwealth to be affixed at Frankfort in
the nineteenth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand
and Eight hundred and nine and of the Commonwealth
