Mr. Regenhardt, 810 Jurie, died at 10 Thursday morning at Southeast Missouri Hospital after an extended illness. He was 73 years old.

Mr. Regenhardt was born Dec. 26, 1900, in Cape Girardeau to the late Mr. and Mrs. Edward Edward Regenhardt. He attended Lorimier, Broadway and Central High Schools. He also attended SEMO State University.

Mr. Regenhardt was associated with Regenhardt Construction Co. from 1923 to 1941. He also was associated with McCarthy Construction Co. in Panama. When he returned from Panama, he entered the Navy, where he was a lieutenant in the Seabees during World War II.

He was married to the former Miss Lois McNeely on March 31, 1923 in Leemon.

Mr. Regenhardt was the Cape Girardeau postmaster for 13 years, served as Cape County collector and was active in fund raising and civic organizations.
